Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Christian marriage is a lifelong covenant between one man and one woman, binding both spouses to self-giving love and exclusive fidelity. Unfortunately, a tragic result of our fallen nature is that many marriages end in divorce. While the Church mourns this reality, it also recognizes that there are situations in which it is right and good to bless the remarriage of a divorced person. If Christian marriage is what you seek, we want to help you discern your readiness and help you prepare for your new commitment.

In addition to the general provisions relating to marriage in the Anglican Church in North America ("ACNA"), the ACNA Canons require that, if either party has ever been divorced, you must obtain permission from the bishop before you can remarry in the ADNE per <u>ACNA Canon II.7.</u> The Application for Remarriage in the Church is included in this packet.

As you contemplate remarriage, some things are critical to creating the best possible chance for a successful union:

- You must intend a lifelong union.
- You must be seeking God's help.
- You must have worked through your part in the breakdown of the previous marriage.
- You must be actively worshipping and participating in a Christian church.
- You must engage in the program of premarital counseling prescribed by the priest and this
 diocese.

The rest of this booklet is designed to assist you and your priest to make this beginning, and to give you the understanding, tools, and God's grace to succeed in this most common, most transforming, vocation.

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A. To Be Completed by the Priest

This information is to be mailed to the Bishop, who must approve all remarriages of divorced persons in this diocese, at least (60) sixty days prior to the date of the proposed marriage.
